Q My child does not have a Creative Writing Mark – why not?

A Only those children who achieved the eligible score in English and Maths had their creative writing put forward for marking. If your child had their Creative Writing marked, you will see either 'of the standard' or 'not of the standard'.

Q How do I access my child's results?

A The outcome of the Entrance Test will be sent to the email address included on the application form.

Q How many candidates sat the entrance test for The Blue Coat School in entry in September 2023

A | A total of 1089 candidates sat the test at The Blue Coat School.

Q | What is my child's raw score for each test?

A The Blue Coat School considers this information to be commercially sensitive under exemption 43(2) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 which states that information is exempt of information if its disclosure under the Act would, or would be likely to, prejudice the commercial interests of any person.

Q When will I know if I have been offered a place at The Blue Coat School?

A The National Offer date is 1st March 2025.

Q | Can I see my child's test papers?

A It is not possible to see a candidate's test papers as they are commercially sensitive and the property of FSCE Ltd.

Q | Can papers be remarked?

A All the entrance tests are double scanned and checked using different optical mark readers and different staff. The process is reliable and trustworthy and as a result remarks would be unnecessary. The likelihood of any mistake being made in recording the correct test responses from the multiple choice answer sheet is negligible. We will therefore not undertake any test re-marks until after the national offer date (1st March 2024). The cost of a re-mark to parents is £75 per paper.

Please note that Creative Writing is not eligible for a re-mark. This is because they have already been manually judged by a minimum of 10 individual members of staff from The Blue Coat School who are aware of the standard required for entry.

Q I have received my child's results and would like to know their ranking position?

A Ranking positions are only shared with applicants in Group B to help with making choices on the Local Authority preference form. Unfortunately, it is not school policy to share the Entrance Test ranking position to all applicants.

Q | Can I appeal?

A You cannot appeal about your child's test mark. Your offer letter from your Local Authority on 1st March 2025 will contain details of how to appeal if you have not been offered a place at your preferred school.

Q I would like to make a Freedom of Information request for an anonymised copy of the results.

A This information will be published on the school's website in May 2025. We are not obliged under section 22 of the FOIA to provide information that is intended for future publication. In line with the terms of this exemption, we have considered whether it would be in the public interest for us to provide you with the information ahead of publication, despite the exemption being applicable. In this case, we have concluded that the public interest favours withholding the information.
